Scarborough Health Network (SHN) is a community teaching network, located in one of the most diverse and vibrant communities in Canada. - Creation of an annual workplan to achieve the goals of the strategic priorities for SHNRI and SHN
- Oversight and direction of all SHNRI research activities
- Fostering partnerships and coordination across the research and innovation ecosystem—and, importantly, with the Scarborough community—to ensure meaningful engagement, scale and relevance
- Investing strategically in projects, talent and infrastructure to build capacity and enable high-quality research
- Enabling knowledge translation to fulfill the potential of research for patients and for the health system including addressing drivers of equity and access to health care in diverse communities
- Ability to successfully lead a team to support the creation of structures, processes, and systems that will advance the creation and integration of research, teaching, and clinical activities
- Ensuring diverse patient and community voices are represented in research priorities and in individual protocols
- Oversight of research team and staff

The Vice President, Research is an inspirational and distinguished academic with significant leadership and administrative management experience. Additional requirements include:

- A PhD and/or MD and a relevant Master's degree from an accredited institution is required, along with a demonstrated proficiency in research methodologies, acquired through formal training or equivalent experience.

  activities.
- Inclusive leader with a demonstrated strong commitment to principles of Equity, Diversity, Anti-Racism, and Inclusion.
